INDUSTRY INSIGHT

Often the best place to find data and insight on a sector is from governing bodies, national agencies, and trade unions. For Financial Services this includes:

Scottish Financial Enterprise (SFE)

SFE is the representative body for Scotland's financial services industry, with sector news and events, 'A Future in Finance' education engagement programme, support for young professionals within the sector and insight into Scotland's place in global financial services.

UK Financial Services Skills Commission (UK)

Research and reports on the UK Financial Services sector skills needs. Includes a skills gap analysis and <u>Future Skills</u> <u>Framework</u> describing key behaviours the sector needs.

FinTech Scotland

A strategic enabler of Financial Technology across Scotland, working to expand and strengthen FinTech across education, industry, and enterprise. Their 'Why Scotland' section has FinTech profiles for Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh, Fife, Glasgow, Perth, and Stirling. There is also insight into FinTech Innovation Labs and a Skills & Talent area.

WIDER FOCUS: Financial Services often operates across a UK or global network. Organisations like <u>Deloitte's</u>, <u>PwC</u> and <u>McKinsey</u> produce research with this wider financial services focus.

SPECIALIST FIELD: there are a number of specialist roles in financial & professional services, which may have their own governing bodies, national agencies and/or trade unions. For example, for an <u>Actuary</u> the Institute & faculty of Actuaries.

LMI for Learning

Marketplace

Joint DYW and SDS opportunity zone for all industry sectors, with finance linked work inspiration and preparation content for young people and well as experience opportunities. There are also 'influencer' events and resources for professionals, parents & carers.

A Future in Finance (formerly the Unified Schools Programme) SFE partnership programme to help inspire young people in Scotland through dedicated resources and outreach activities. Partners include Investment 20/20, Future Assets and Career Ready.

Experience

Example: Investment 20/20

Gaining experience can open career doors. There are organisations that support this for school, college and/or graduate leavers such as Investment 20/20 who arrange employment placements.

Deloitte Early Career Programmes

Larger financial businesses and institutions may have talent development programmes from school level – like ASPIRE, FinTech for Schools and Career Shapers - through to apprenticeships, graduate placements or training.

Specialist Media / Jobsites

Finance linked jobs appears within most job sites but, just as finance focused media, like the <u>Financial Times (FT)</u> or <u>DIGIT</u> in Scotland can offer unique sector insight, specialist job sites can offer opportunity not found elsewhere – see <u>Investopedia</u> best job websites.

Private Sector Jobsites

91% of Scottish employer surveyed used internal web and social media resources when recruiting (from <u>Employer Skills</u> <u>Survey</u>). Looking at finance business vacancy pages and following them on social media can pay off.

Explore business start-up options.

Apprenticeship.Scot

Includes useful tools such as <u>'Explore your</u> options' showing where Foundation Apprenticeships (FA) might lead and the academic value colleges and universities give FA's (usually 1 Higher at A or B).

SDS Statistics area

Scottish Funding Council (SFC): College Leaver Destinations

In this annual report you can see number of leavers by subject areas and level of study and an indication of general destinations work, further study, etc.

Discover Uni

Allows you to view individual university course data, including specific finance or business centred courses and compare individual course / university insight, such as, student satisfaction rates, average earnings and employment after the course.
