Supporting teachers, other practitioners, and a range of partners across Scotland to play their complementary roles in delivering young people's entitlement to a meaningful career education.

Our suite of professional learning workshops introduce career education, explore why it matters and the benefits it brings to young people and practitioners.

All workshops provide practical approaches to help integrate career education into day-to-day learning and support teachers and other practitioners to do this in a proportionate and manageable way. They can be offered in a standard format or tailored to better reflect your establishment's progress and needs; either as a single event or as part of an extended programme.

Theme	Description	Delivery formats
Career Education	Within this theme we introduce career education, set it in context and explore the benefits that it brings to education settings and learners. There is an opportunity for establishments to reflect on their progress, evaluate how they are meeting the Career Education Standard entitlements and to identify next steps using a self-evaluation process. Skills	This theme provides a focus on future skills, their importance to learners and explores how these can be integrated into everyday classroom practice. Areas that could be covered as part of a workshop include, an introduction to meta-skills, how to embed a common skills language across the curriculum or evaluating progress on your embedding skills journey. LMI	This workshop explores what Labour Market Information (LMI) is, where to find it and how practitioners can further integrate it into everyday classroom practice.	In person Virtual
CMS	This workshop introduces Career Management Skills (CMS), considers how CMS features as part of day-to-day learning and teaching and looks at practical approaches to develop young people's CMS.	In person Virtual
DYW	Building on the success of our online programme over the last few years, we aim to continue the development of content that supports the wider DYW themes across education.	Virtual
